About the Editors

JONATHAN M. ZENILMAN, MD

Dr. Jonathan Zenilman is Professor of Medicine and Chief of the Infectious Diseases Division at Johns Hopkins Bayview Medical Center. His career in sexually transmitted infections (STIs) started at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, where he was responsible for developing the national gonococcal isolate surveillance system. His STI-related activities have included being the director of clinical services at the Baltimore City Health Department and a translational research program in the epidemiology of gonococcal resistance, behavioral interventions, and HIV/STI interactions. He is a former president of the American STD Association.

MOHSEN SHAHMANESH, MD, FRCP

Dr. Mohsen Shahmanesh was born in Teheran, Iran. He completed his medical training in the United Kingdom and specialized in endocrinology with his MD thesis on the pituitary-hypothalamic control of gonadotrophin secretion.

Between 1975 and 1981, he was associate professor of medicine and endocrinology at Shiraz University, Iran. Returning to England in 1983, he retrained in genitourinary medicine at St. Thomas' Hospital, and in 1988 became consultant in GU medicine and HIV at Birmingham General Hospital and the University of Birmingham, United Kingdom. Among a number of senior posts in the speciality, he pursued his deep interest in teaching by becoming chairman of the specialist advisory committee for GU Medicine at the Royal College of Physicians of London. Between 1996 and 2002, he edited the journal *Sexually Transmitted Infections* (changing its name from *Genitourinary Medicine*). He was a member of the Department of Health's expert advisory group on AIDS. In 2008 he was awarded life fellowship by the British Association of Sexual Health and HIV. He retired from clinical medicine in January 2010. His research interests include nongonococcal urethritis; the neurological complications of HIV; and the effects of currently used antiviral treatment regimens for HIV on glucose, cortisol and lipid metabolism, and adipocyte gene expression.
