

OVERVIEW

Although chronic illness and the long-term effects of injury may have different physical attributes, the psychosocial aspects of having a chronic condition are quite similar. The feelings of uncertainty, social isolation, powerlessness, the illness experience, the loss, and issues of emotional and physical intimacy, to name only a few, are all remarkably comparable across conditions. Family caregivers of someone with a chronic condition are similarly affected. Each patient and caregiver is trying to adapt to a 'new normal' whether the patient has multiple sclerosis, cancer, dementia or the residual effects of a traumatic brain injury. This text remains the only nursing text dedicated completely to the psychosocial effects of a chronic condition.

The journey of the author and her husband through cancer is chronicled throughout a number of chapters. These feelings about the illness experience, and ultimately his death, are real and are excerpted from the author's journal.

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

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
