

KEY UPDATES

- Important data updates have been made throughout the text. As the student will learn,
 health care and physical therapy are constantly being updated with research on effective
 techniques, changes in healthcare policy, and new technology advances.
- APTA documents have been added, including the Vision Statement, Strategic Plan,
 Minimum Required Skills of PTA Graduates at Entry Level, Decision-Making Guide,
 and Value-Based Behaviors for the PTA.
- The addition of ethical dilemmas enables the student to understand the process of dealing with ethical issues and to work through the process to make a decision.
- Practice issues such as elder abuse, harassment, development of professional attributes,
 and good teaching practices are introduced.
- Two new chapters have been developed to assist students in successful learning and career development. The focus is on developing career-ready skills and behaviors and understanding how to formulate a plan for lifelong learning and career success.
